What is cyberbullying?

Cyberbullying is bullying that takes place over digital devices

Cyberbullying can occur through services where people can view, participate in, or share content. Cyberbullying includes sending, posting, or sharing negative, harmful, false, or mean content about someone else

- → Text messaging and messaging apps on mobile or tablet devices
- → Online forums and chat rooms
- → Email
- → Online gaming communities

If you feel uneasy with something happening online, ask for help!


